



Level 3 Health, 333 2009

Aims/General Learning Outcomes

- To be able to critically reflect on how attitudes, values, behaviours, policies and laws influence the wellbeing of self, others and society in New Zealand and the international community.
- To be able to identify health enhancing actions that reflects the values of social justice and addresses the determinants of health.

Course Content

1. **Determinants of Health** – Health Education draws on international research projects carried by the World Health Organisation (WHO) to decide which information is the most important to take notice of when discussing the factors that influence people’s well-being. This topic explores these factors which WHO call the ‘determinants of health’. This topic is not assessed but is an underlying concept for Level 3.
2. **Contemporary New Zealand Health Practices** – Students will consider and research the health practices available to New Zealand for a specific health issue.
3. **Analyse a health issue for a particular group within New Zealand society** – This unit examines a health issue within New Zealand and the implications it has on wellbeing at an interpersonal and societal level.
4. **An International Health Issue** – This unit considers the factors that have led to the spread of HIV/AIDS in sub Sahara Africa, the implications on individuals and society, and recommendations to address this.
5. **Ethical Issues** - Students will analyse a contemporary dilemma or ethical issue in relation to wellbeing from differing perspectives. The possible implications of the differing perspectives on the wellbeing of individuals, others and society will be explored.

Appeals

Any queries about an assessment decision should be made to your class teacher when the assessment is handed back.
