Aims / General Learning Outcomes

At the end of this course students should be able to:

- translate into idiomatic English simple adapted or unadapted Latin with the aid of a glossary and/or word list
- answer in English questions set in English on a passage of simple adapted or unadapted Latin with the aid of a glossary and/or word list and identify simple grammatical structures in context..
- analyse the themes and comment on the content and, where appropriate, the style of prescribed Latin text.
- describe aspects of Roman culture and the continuing influence of Roman civilisation on Western Civilisation, the European base of New Zealand culture, including the English language.

Course Content (in brief)

Set Reading Roman Women, one of the set texts will be read and studied in detail.

- **Roman Civilisation**
At least one of the topics Urban life or Roman Entertainment will be studied.
- **Grammar**
Structures learnt in previous years will be revised and others set for Level One will be covered.
- **Vocabulary**
Vocabulary learnt in previous years will be revised and the list set for Level One will be learned
- **Reading**
Latin will be read and translated into English.

Appeals

Any queries about an assessment decision should be made to your class teacher when the assessment is handed back. Any formal appeals should be made, within one week of the assessed work being returned, to Mrs Hickey, head of Latin who will investigate it further or by the NZQA Liaison teacher, Term 1 Ms Lynch, Terms 2-4 Mrs Butler. Work done in pencil or which has 'white-out' corrections cannot be reconsidered for appeals. Appeals need to be made within one school week of receiving a result.

There will be one reassessment opportunity for AS 90117 and AS 90118. It will be available to all eligible students regardless of the level of achievement in the first assessment.
