GENERAL AIM

This course aims to develop in the student the ability to communicate in Māori to Level One of the Marautanga.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- **Whakarongo:** the student will be capable of understanding what is presented to them, relevant to their needs.
- **Kōrero:** the student will be able to express their personal experiences to individuals and groups.
- **Pānui:** the student will be capable of understanding simple written material and is motivated to read in Te Reo Māori.
- **Tuhituhi:** the student will be able to write simple stories about personal experiences leading to the development of understanding and motivation to write.

	Pānui: find similar word or phrases, answer questions in Māori and English
TERM 2	Topic 2: Hui Whānau ara te huritau, te mārena, te iriri, te hura kohatu, te aha
	Tuhituhi: purongo, pakiwaitara, whakaaturanga, tono/ pānui
TERM 3	Topic 3: Taiohi Māori Rongonui nō te āo hākinakina, te pouaka whakaata, te āo puoro, te kiriata hoki,
	Pānui: ngā purongo, pānui me ngā pakiwaitara
TERM 4	Tuhituhi: whakapaakari i ngā purongo, pakiwaitara, whakaaturanga, tono/ pānui
