Aims/General Learning Outcomes

- This course is designed to complete Unit Standards which contribute to the National Certificate in Tourism and Travel (Introductory Skills) Level Two.
- This is a vocational course designed to prepare students for employment in the tourism and travel industry and focuses on the Level Three credits in this course.

Course Content

The course covers two main tourism destinations: New Zealand and Australia.

People credited with these unit standards are able to:

1. locate and name destinations
2. identify travel times between destinations by various travel modes
3. describe various types of accommodation
4. locate and describe key geographic features and related activities
5. identify and describe attractions, activities and events
6. describe travel information that would assist tourists
7. provide information about travel related products

Assessment Details

Two assignment- based assessments are completed during the course. Students will be given opportunity to work on these in class and in their own time. Students will be expected to meet milestones for completion of Elements within the assignments.

Appeals
